

Dual Enrollment for High School Students



The Tennessee Dual Enrollment program is an enrichment program for high school juniors and seniors. High school students who are eligible for the Dual Enrollment program can take college courses while they are still enrolled in high school and receive college credit.



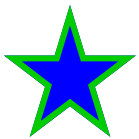
Every junior and senior high school student is eligible for a Tennessee Dual Enrollment Grant available through the Tennessee Education Lottery Scholarship fund as long as the student meets admission requirements at an approved post-secondary institution and/or currently maintains a 2.75 GPA in previous college courses (if applicable). Currently, the award is \$300 per semester and \$600 per academic year (\$200 per quarter).



The money that students receive from the Tennessee Dual Enrollment Grant will NOT affect the money they receive from the Tennessee HOPE lottery scholarship when they graduate. The Dual Enrollment Grant is lottery money that is reserved just for dual-credit students to award these students for their academic achievements.



The Tennessee Dual Enrollment Grant is deducted from the cost of tuition up front. For example, if a 3 credit hour dual credit course is \$450, the Tennessee Dual Enrollment Grant of \$300 would be deducted ($\$450 - \$300 = \150) and the student would owe only \$150. Students can also apply other fee waivers toward their tuition. For example, dependents of public schools teachers and state employees receive a 25% discount on tuition.



The Workforce Investment Act (WIA) program may be able to assist Juniors and Senior students with unmet need to pay for the remaining tuition, textbooks, and any required supplies. For example, eligible students that qualify for Workforce Investment Act services could receive the remaining \$150 (see previous example) and receive funding for textbooks and supplies. Hence, for qualified students, the dual-enrollment classes could be *free*.
